Bible and the 2nd Amendment



Competing Claims for the Christian Church

Two Biblical Trajectories for Love of Others

* Love in relation to God (Gen1:26-27; 9:6; Gen 18-19; Jud 19; Mt 25:31-46; 1 Jn 4:7-21)

* Love in relation to self (Lev 19:18b; Golden Rule Mt 7:12; Lk 6:3; Greater Love Jn 15:13)

Mic 4:3-4

- * 3 He shall judge between many peoples, and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more;
- * 4 but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid; for the mouth of the LORD of hosts has spoken.

10 Commandments

- * Ex. 20:13 You shall not murder.a
- * Deut. 5:17 You shall not murder.a
- * This is the basis of our ability to relate to YHWH our God
 - * Taking of human life viewed as problematic
 - * Can be translated "murder" or "kill" presenting ambiguity (taking of human life viewed a problem)
 - * Does not offer an exception for "self-defense" or even "war"

Thus

- * Evident goal for Judeo Christian Community is a world without violence
- Weapons of war (destruction) will become implements of agriculture (production)
- * End to weaponry is the ideal towards which we drive
- * Evident in the work of two prophets' visions of Messianic expectation

The Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America

* A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

Exegesis of the 2nd Amendment

Problems with Grammar/Syntax of 2nd Amendment

- * This is a horrible sentence formed of **poor grammar and failing punctuation** (syntax)
- * Is a militia a necessity for our nation when we have 5 standing, well funded, and well staffed branches of military service and a plethora of local, state, and federal police agencies?
- * Further the Amendment contains competing ideas
 - * The notion of a "well regulated militia" suggests that there will be a **regulatory organ**, while "not be infringed" suggest **no regulation**
- * One statement implies government control and the other implies an un-infringed right. This Amendment is **internally contradictory**

Problems with the Context of the 2nd Amendment

- * This Amendment was written during a different period, with different concerns than those we face today.
- * It was written in the year 1791, more than 230 years ago!
- * When it was written there were only 3,929,214 people in this nation (it was a little more than a 1/100th the size of our nation today)
- * It was written when much of the country was still yet to be "acquired" from the indigenous Americans and Mexicans...there was active conflict
- * It was written when there were many **more dangerous wild animals** (like bears, mountain lions, wolverines, wolves, bison, coyotes, etc.) actively inhabiting places where people lived
- * It was written when muskets & flintlock pistols that could **only fire at a rate of two to three shots a minute** were the dominant firearms available to the general population
- * It was written when the **military branches of the United States were nascent** and not as well established as they are today so they may have needed a "well regulated militia" to supplement them

Militias Today

- * Often militias are the source of the problem, perpetuating a white supremacist agenda and imperiling our democracy as we saw when:
 - * The Wolverine Watchmen threatened to assassinate Governor Gretchen Whitmer, of Michigan in October of 2020
 - Or the Proud boys tried to overthrow our democracy and assassinate Speaker Pelosi and Vice President Pence at the U.S. Capitol on Jan 6, 2021
 - * Or the Patriot front were caught in the back of a U-Haul truck on their way to violently disrupt a Pride parade in Idaho in June of 2022

Who Wrote this Amendment?

- * Perhaps then we will realize that it was written by the same people that gave us the legalized taking of other peoples' land and the ethnic cleansing and genocide of the indigenous American population!
- * Then we will realize that this Amendment was given to us by the same people that gave us **legalized slavery** and turned our black and brown ancestors into property who had no rights, who declared them 3/5ths of a human being.
- Then we will realize that this **Constitutional Amendment was given to us by those people who are the source of many other bad ideas**that we have grown to reject in our contemporary world...so why do we not question the veracity of these 26 words?

Bible vs. 2nd Amendment

- * The Bible:
 - * Values human life above all creation
 - * Says the way we treat others is how we treat God
 - * Works towards an elimination of weapons
- * The Second Amendment:
 - * Values guns above human life
 - * Is problematic in its text, context, and authorship
 - * Is used as a basis for the proliferation of weapons

Conclusion

- * As Christian community we see irreconcilable ends
- * To choose the Biblical perspective puts us at odds with American gun culture (2020 45,000; 2021 49,000)
- * To be true to our faith commitment we should be circumspect in how we view our 2nd Amendment and the gun culture it produces
- * We are faced with contrast between God's Word and a synthetic and plastic document
- * We have the power (agency) to reconfigure the 2nd Amendment and American culture to make it consonant with God's views
